Clothes Closet

Our clothes closet volunteers continue to be busy sorting donations, filling racks, and helping clients. We've seen a large increase in client visits this winter as the price of goods has gone up. Many new families are coming, and some have only been in the country a short time.

We recently were able to repurpose a storage room next to the clothes closet that allows us to better store clothes that won't fit on the racks and to replenish the supply as clients shop.

Due to the increase in clients, help is needed to sort clothes, register and checkin clients, restock, and assist clients in the shopping process every other Tuesday from 9:30-11:30 am and every other Wednesday from 9 am-12 pm. Food Pantry

The food pantry hit a new record on February 1, serving 98 families or a total of 404 people. We are so blessed by the faithful giving to Helping Hands that allows us to serve all who seek food. The giving also allows us to purchase what we need on a weekly basis, as food shortages at the Oregon Food Bank continue.

In January, Sunset Youth bagged 1,400 applesauce cups for easy distribution to our clients. They are awesome!

This fall and winter we received over 4,000 lbs. of food from community donors including Kuni BMW, BSD Community Transition Program, Boy Scouts/Oak Hills Turkey Trot, Cedar Hills/Sunset Lions Club and more. We are *very fortunate* to be in such an amazing community!
